ECR Spotlight : Leonie Cloos, Ph.D.

Bio: Leonie's research is mainly focused on very fundamental measurement of self-reported emotions, including quantitatively evaluating different affect measures and emotion items in terms of their applicability and importance of daily life measures. Leonie's current grant project will continue exploring the measurement of momentary affect by examining how participants interpret and respond to both momentary and retrospective assessment prompts, and how their response processes differ across items. This project will leverage mixed methods designs and collect more qualitative information, extending on work of fellow MITNBers Dr. Dominique Maciejewski (on response processes) and Dr. Katie Hoemann (on linguistic features & topic modeling).
